



# Evaluation of Public Health Empowerment Program - Surveillance for Polio Surveillance Officers (PHEP-SPO) in Sudan

## Project Information

## OBJECTIVES

The PHEP-SPO main goal is supporting the Federal Ministry of Health (FMOH) in Sudan to empower public health and sustain polio eradication and strengthening routine immunization system. GHD, in collaboration with CDC, will support independent evaluation of implemented PHEP SPO to assess the impact of the program on the national health system.

## REGIONS OF WORK

The project was implemented in Sudan

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The PHEP- SPO program equips officers with skills needed to complement their current roles of supporting the FMOH and State Ministries of Health (SMOH) efforts in sustaining Polio Eradication, strengthening routine immunization, and contributing to strengthening the national health system. This initiative was mainly targeting Polio officers but, in the case of Sudan, it was offered to the surveillance officers because it is an integrated surveillance system.

Four cohorts of PHEP-SPO were trained during 2017 through 2019. The assessment of the first cohort, conducted in 2018, showed a significant impact of the training on the performance of the surveillance officers even though the assessment was only to the first cohort. GHD supported an independent evaluation of the four cohorts using different indicators. The evaluation objectives were mainly to ensure training effectiveness, to determine the effect of “PHEP-SPO” training on the performance of EPI officers and the quality of the surveillance at the locality level.

## BENEFICIARIES

The Sudan Federal and states Ministry of Health. In specific, the ministry Expanded Program of Immunization (EPI) at central and district levels.

## PROJECT PHASES

**Phase 1:** contract an international consultant to conduct evaluation of the PHEP-SP

**Phase 2:** Develop evaluation protocol using different indicators such as participants’ reactions, learning, performance indicators, service indicators, and outcome indicators.

**Phase 3:** data collection, analysis and report writing followed by dissemination to key stakeholders.

## Currently . . .

The Sudan FMOH raised with GHD in 2016, the shortage in trained human resources responsible for public health surveillance and the need to empower the management and leadership skills for the workforce at the district levels to sustain polio eradication and strengthen capacities to control/eliminate vaccine preventable diseases.

The PHEP-SPO was developed, and its components was agreed on with FMOH, WHO and national stakeholder. Four cohorts were implemented to build the capacity of Polio and EPI staff and equip them with competencies essential to public health surveillance and managerial skills. Hence fill the gap in trained workforce, that is usually encountered at the district level for various public health services.

## What's next . . .

The PHEP-SPO supported the implementation of polio transitional planning and assisted in expanding the technical capacity of Polio and EPI staff to fill gaps in manpower needed for public health priorities without compromising their original roles and functions to sustain polio eradication and support RI activities.

The evaluation aims to support the sustainability of the program by FMOH through an evidence base demonstrating the gains achieved by the PHEP-SPO. Namely, on addressing FMOH need to have a pool of trained EPI/polio officers equipped with the necessary skills to effectively work for public health surveillance, management of VPDs outbreak, perform assigned new roles to run the integrated VPDs surveillance system, which used to be carried out by the state level.

## By the Numbers

**4 PHEP-SPO cohorts** graduated **112 surveillance officers**, representing **50% of localities** in Sudan and serving in **16 out of 18** states in Sudan.
