About Us



The Eastern Mediterranean Public Health Network (EMPHNET) is a public health nonprofit organization leading support for better health in the Eastern Mediterranean Region (EMR) and beyond. Established in 2009, EMPHNET has been recognized for advancing applied epidemiology, supporting public health programs, advancing public health research, and empowering communication and networking for improved public health practice. EMPHNET works mainly with ministries of health and public health agencies, while collaborating with stakeholders across the public health system including relevant ministries, universities, community organizations, research institutes, the private sector, nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), international organizations, UN agencies, among others.

We provided various forms of technical assistance to countries in a wide range of public health areas. We worked extensively in data management for different public health purposes and used digital solutions in public health services, interventions, and activities. We assisted in needed logistics for various partners and facilitated timely and adequate resource mobilization and delivery of equipment, especially in countries affected by limitations. We broke the language barrier to ensure knowledge sharing and provided support in professional translation and localization services to a wide range of partners.

We support workforce development based on country needs and with a focus on applied epidemiology, a discipline at the heart of public health practice. We also work with the region's public health programs to ensure quality health service delivery in alignment with national and global frameworks and plans. A special area is dedicated to operational and implementation research given their utmost importance to informing decision-making for better public health programming and policies. We facilitate networking and communication for public health at all levels to create opportunities for change.

While using expertise in areas focused on serving public health, our mission is made possible by several factors. We operate from within the region and have direct contact with ministries of health which facilitates our work as we respond to country needs. We have offices in several countries of the region in the most hard-to-reach areas and access to communities in need of public health services. As the Field Epidemiology Training Programs' (FETPs) network for the region, we have a roster of thousands of field epidemiologists to deploy in response to emergencies. Areas of Focus





Guided by the overarching healthpertinent Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), EMPHNET works to improve reproductive, maternal and child health; strengthen immunization; prevent and control non-communicable and communicable diseases: achieve universal health coverage; combat health consequences of climate change; support environmental health as part of its One Health approach; and develop knowledge and skills of the public health workforce. EMPHNET works in line with the goals outlined in the Global Health Security Agenda (GHSA), the Global Immunization Agenda 2030 (IA2030), the Polio Eradication Strategy, the Global Strategy for Women's, Children's and Adolescents' Health, implementation roadmap 20232030 for the Global action plan for the prevention and control of NCDs 2013–2030, the Quadripartite One Health Joint Plan of Action, and the International Health Regulations, including surveillance and outbreak preparedness and response.

In support of global, regional, and national public health efforts, EMPHNET has four areas of focus: workforce development, public health programs, research and policy, and communication and networking. Under each area, EMPHNET promotes intersectoral and multi-disciplinary coordination most notably One Health and emphasizes factors that significantly influence health and well-being such as gender, culture, equity, education, environment, and sociopolitical context.



Workforce Development

EMPHNET designs, implements, and supports training courses and programs to address identified needs of public health students and professionals. Our training courses and programs are customized to country and regional contexts and are designed to build practice-based knowledge in applied epidemiology, emergency preparedness and response, immunization programs, interpersonal communication, biorisk management, public health during mass gatherings, one health, climate change, research, and more. To accommodate trainee preferences, we offer learning in a variety of formats: face-to-face, online, and blended.

Our role as a network of FETPs enables us to create learning opportunities for existing programs while leading support for the establishment of new ones of various modalities. We also integrate fundamental concepts of field epidemiology, and more broadly applied epidemiology, into training curricula that essentially target professionals from the non-FETP field to extend this essential knowledge to as many public health workers as possible.

Public Health Programs

EMPHNET provides technical assistance to ministries of health in the main components of public health programming, including design, planning, implementation, and evaluation. EMPHNET's assistance encompasses most programs with a focus on interventions and activities pertinent to polio eradication; immunization strengthening; biorisk management; control and prevention of communicable and non-communicable diseases; nutrition; promotion and protection of the health of children, women, adolescents, the elderly, and vulnerable and at risk populations; emergency preparedness and response; mass gatherings; and One Health including the focus areas of climate change and environmental health. The extent of assistance covers the national, subnational, and peripheral levels where we build capacities to enhance the performance of disease surveillance and registry systems, quality and inclusiveness of service delivery, the efficacy of partner and community engagement, and emergency planning and response. Relying on its context-specific and prominent experience in public health programs strengthening, EMPHNET also guides partners and stakeholders in the implementation of tested actions that fit the complexity and diversity of the region's situation.

Research and Policy

EMPHNET contributes significantly to the advancement of public health research in the EMR. Its work has helped generate new knowledge and insights into various public health issues in the region, informing policies and evidence-based interventions with the overarching goal of improving population health.

EMPHNET conducts and supports a wide range of studies and assessments on context-specific topics tailored to public health issues in the EMR. Some of the areas of research include outbreak investigation and response, public health surveillance, infectious diseases, non-communicable diseases, mental health, maternal and child health, One Health, digital health, biosafety and biosecurity, and environmental health.

EMPHNET's research is focused on identifying health problems, developing, and evaluating evidence-based interventions, developing implementation strategies, informing health programs and policies, and evaluating public health programs and policy effectiveness. EMPHNET ensures the translation and dissemination of scientific findings from the region.
