WHY EMPHNET IS INVOLVED

- **SDG 3** targets aim, by 2030, to reduce maternal mortality to under 70 per 100,000 live births and ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health services, including family planning, education, and integration into national strategies.
- 72% of the 16 million people in need of healthcare in the Eastern Mediterranean Region are women and children (WHO-EMRO).
- As of March 15, 2024, **maternal mortality rates** were as **high** as 692, 638, and 140 per 100,000 live births in Somalia, Afghanistan, and Pakistan, respectively (WHO-EMRO).
- Neonatal mortality remains high across the region, with maternal socioeconomic status being a key determinant. (WHO-EMRO).
- Cost-effective measures, including HPV vaccination and early detection and treatment of breast cancer, could prevent 73,000 deaths and provide substantial returns on investment (WHO).
- In crisis contexts, mental health challenges are prevalent, with an average prevalence of mental disorders for women aged 12–75 years at 49%. (WHO-EMRO).



ENHANCING PRIMARY HEALTHCARE FOR WOMEN AND CHILDREN

Developed a roadmap for modernizing Primary Healthcare Services (PHC) services by introducing the innovative Family Health Teams (FHT) approach to meet the evolving health needs of Jordanians as well as the refugee population in Jordan. The roadmap included the framework, strategies, tools, materials, and necessary arrangements to introduce the FHT approach and reach the standards of care suggested by the family health model.

Launched the Restrengthening Primary Health Care-EMPHNET Roadmap through the adoption of FHT as a teambased model of PHC care to offer community health services based on PHC modern values.

Supported the Family Community Medicine Teams (FCMT) project in Jordan by mapping and identifying gaps in the existing information and education and communication materials to better respond to the needs and expectations of patients in vulnerable and marginalized populations.

Developed training packages for all stakeholders and workers in FCMT and trained **30** trainers, **100** health professionals, and **200** community workers in Irbid and Mafraq governorates.

Based on the FCMT project, the Jordan Ministry of Health UNICEF developed the Primary Health Care Guidelines for Health Centers to improve access to these services, enhance their quality, and encourage greater use by all citizens and residents of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, regardless of their nationality.



STRENGTHENING SURVEILLANCE AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS

Developed and rolled out a computerized harmonized, digital Reproductive Health Registry (hRHR) in 19 health facilities in Mafraq. The registry digitizes existing mother and child health-care files and is synchronized and interoperable with the Ministry of Health's information system. The system also includes a non-computerized hRHR to allow for broader reach.

The *h*RHR significantly improved continuity of care, confidentiality and easy retrieval of their health data, as shown in an independent evaluation which also noted that the *h*RHR system can be scalable to offer a transformative opportunity for nationwide implementation.





EMPOWERING WOMEN'S ENGAGEMENT IN SERVICE DESIGN, DELIVERY, AND UTILIZATION



Developed, translated, and adapted a low-intensity psychosocial intervention to improve sexual and reproductive health services for adolescent girls and young women in refugee communities through the SEEK Trial, guided by community-based participatory research principles.

CO-IMPLEMENTING INTERVENTIONS

Launched the Public Health Empowerment Program for Nutrition Officers (PHEP-Nutrition) with the co-design and co-implementation of nutrition officers working at various levels of the health system in Sudan. This initiative aimed to enhance participants' skills and knowledge, thereby improving their contributions to nutrition and other maternal and child health (MCH) interventions in the country.

~12,500 students received the health messages through health education awareness materials, communication with the parents, and health campaigns in its first phase.

USING INNOVATIVE APPROACHES TO SCALE UP SERVICE DESIGN AND DELIVERY

To support the Integrated School Health (ISH) Project in Jordan in service of Syrian Refugee communities, EMPHNET developed the Digital ISH Data Management System for the digitalization of student's health records for students of refugee communities in Zaatari, Azraq, and Cyber camps. The data management system centralizes the collection, storage, and analysis of student health data, supporting strategic planning and policy development. It features a web-based platform with an Android version for offline data entry, recording comprehensive student health information and service results, reflecting paper-based health card fields.


