PROJECT DESCRIPTION

GHD in collaboration with CDC supported Afghanistan Polio Management Information System (APMIS) Training Workshop which was a successful initiative aimed at enhancing the skills of healthcare workers and program managers involved in polio eradication efforts. The project focused on improving data management and reporting practices within the polio vaccination campaign, particularly in regions with high transmission rates. Benefiting healthcare workers, program managers, and data entry personnel from various health facilities, the workshop provided practical training on data collection, analysis, and the use of digital tools. The project was executed in multiple phases, including preparation, implementation, follow-up, sustainability, and closing, ensuring a comprehensive approach to skill enhancement. The successful completion of the workshop significantly strengthened the capacity of participants, fostering collaboration and a unified strategy to combat polio in Afghanistan, thus marking a critical advancement in the country's immunization efforts.

As a result, the workshop successfully conducted in Amman and facilitated by CDC and GHD.
